How to Register for Classes

Courses that you formerly watched televised at NVC will now be videostreamed to your home or work computer or laptop. YOU WILL NO LONGER BE ABLE TO SELF REGISTER FOR THESE COURSES. Please follow the following registration protocol beginning Summer/Fall 2009:

1. Please pick up a paper schedule from NVC or access the schedule online <http://odu.site.advantalink.com/#CourseSchedules.cfm>.
COURSES FOR NVC STUDENTS WILL NO LONGER BE VISIBLE IN LEO!
2. Complete and fax or drop off a paper registration to the Northern Virginia Center. Students will be registered on a first come, first served basis beginning Friday April 10th. You do not need a time ticket to register on this day. However your account MUST be free of any holds (advisor, accounts, prereq, Writing Center, etc) IF you have holds, you will not be registered and your registration will be filed until you notify us that your holds have been removed.
3. Please see sample registration page in this schedule – this details HOW your registration paper should be completed. If you do not complete it that way, you will not be able to be registered at that time.
4. You must submit one registration for Summer 09 and one for Fall 09. Courses for the 2 semesters cannot be on the same form.
5. If you would like to register for a WEB BASED COURSE: you may either self register in LEO or you may include this course on your registration page. The CRNs for Web Based courses ARE listed in this schedule.

ODU's Registration Drop/Add/Withdraw form is a legal document. If you do not complete it properly, your registration cannot be processed.

Video Stream slots will be held for Northern Virginia Center students until MAY 1, 2009. Beginning May 1st, you will need written permission from the instructor in addition to a registration form to be added to a course.

Tuition Rates/Payment Options

A one-time registration fee of \$9.00 is assessed every semester.

Please pay attention to tuition deadlines and late fees. These are listed in the *Summer 2009 Academic Calendar* (see second to last page of this schedule). The total tuition is considered fully earned by the University at the start of classes in any semester or summer session. **Please note: Do not wait for a billing statement. The University sends all bills through email to student email accounts. To pay tuition and fees; view charges using LEO Online 48-72 hours after registration. Failure to pay or failure to attend the course after registering is not justification for elimination of charges.**

On-line payment: Access your LEO account and pay online.

Students using Veterans educational benefits may apply to have all tuition and fees deferred. You are responsible for *full payment* at the end of the deferment period, regardless of whether or not you have received funds from the Veterans Administration. To request and obtain deferment, please complete the applicable VA and University forms. **Deferment is on a semester-by-semester basis only—deferment must be requested each semester.** Students using VA Vocational Rehabilitation benefits are not eligible for tuition deferment. Financial Aid Information

Old Dominion University's **CEEB code is 5126**. ODU's **FAFSA code is 003728**. Students applying for financial assistance must submit the following documents:

- ✓ Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to the U.S. Department of Education
- ✓ Financial Aid Consortium Agreement/Enrollment Form and other documentation, as requested, to verify eligibility

Federal Pell Grants are available for undergraduate students *only*, through the FAFSA form and are awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis. Therefore, completion of the FAFSA by the advertised University deadline improves your odds of receiving free aid.

Loan monies are available to virtually all that apply; however, the application process takes approximately eight (8) weeks to complete. Again, early submission of the proper forms is imperative. **Students who apply for aid significantly after the published deadline may be responsible for tuition payment in order to meet tuition deadlines.**

Financial aid funds are first applied to a student's account to pay University charges. If a student's charges exceed the aid awarded, the student is responsible for paying the balance due by the stated tuition deadline. The balance of aid checks will be mailed to students who are to receive funds after University fees have been paid.

Domicile Information

Section 23-7.4 of the Code of Virginia governs eligibility for in-state tuition charges. To be eligible for in-state status, Virginia must be the present, fixed home of the prospective student or parent/guardian to which he/she returns following temporary absences and at which he/she intends to stay indefinitely.

Residence or physical presence in Virginia primarily to attend the University does not entitle an individual to in-state tuition rates.

The primary purpose in moving to Virginia must be to establish residency in Virginia. Residence must be continuous for 365 days preceding the first day of class. In-state tuition privileges are granted only upon application for in-state tuition classification.

It is the responsibility of the student to establish or to file an appeal to change his/her domicile classification prior to the start of classes for the term in question. State law prohibits retroactive consideration of domicile. Students should begin the classification process at least 21 days before the term but in no case can a request be considered after the first day of class. Students who are not 24 years of age prior to the first day of class must provide the Virginia domicile information of a parent/guardian, and must have that parent/guardian sign the application and/or registration form.

Students who are active duty military members are not eligible for in-state rates strictly on the basis of their assignment to the state of Virginia. However, state law has established certain exceptions to the above-stated domicile policies for military members:

- ✓ If a student uses military tuition assistance for any portion of his/her tuition, that portion and all other tuition charges will be assessed at in-state rates for that semester. This provision does not confer in-state residency status, but permits the military member to obtain reduced rates for any semester in which tuition assistance is used.
- ✓ If a military member changes his/her domicile status to Virginia while on active duty, he/she will become eligible for in-state tuition rates immediately, without having to wait the requisite 365 days. However, the appropriate actions must be taken while on active duty for these provisions to take effect; otherwise the normal residency requirements apply. Dependents of the military member may also become eligible for in-state tuition rates at the same time as the military member.

ONCE YOU'VE REGISTERED...Please keep in mind the following key points regarding your class, academic advisement, how to obtain textbooks and more. Please contact us as soon as you have questions or if you require additional information.

Add/Drop/Withdraw

Once you register for a course, you are responsible for all tuition/fees for that course. **The University will NOT drop a student from class rolls for non-payment of tuition, even if the student does not attend the class.** To qualify for a refund or release from charges, you must drop using official procedures and within the published deadlines. For a complete listing of tuition deadlines and fees, policies, and procedures, visit LEO Online at www.odu.edu/nvc, select STUDENTS, then IMPORTANT LINKS, or go to <http://www.leonline.odu.edu>. To drop/withdraw from a course, you must take action via LEO, or complete an Add/Drop Form and turn it in to the Front Desk.

myODU (<https://my.odu.edu>)

myODU is the university portal designed to provide access to a number of online services. After you establish your MIDAS account, you will then use links on the **myOdu** page to set up your University e-mail account and access Leo Online. The portal interface provides content modules that are of interest to students, and is configurable allowing you to select or deselect the available modules to display in your personal view.

E-mail & Blackboard Accounts <http://season.odu.edu/>

ODU Email: University e-mail is required in order to receive communication from main campus and the Northern Virginia Center. ALL students MUST activate their ODU email accounts immediately upon registration for an ODU course. Steps are listed above in the MIDAS and myOdu sections.

Blackboard: Another on-line tool used by faculty and students is Blackboard; however you MUST FIRST ACTIVATE YOUR OLD DOMINION UNIVERSITY EMAIL ACCOUNT. To determine if your instructor will be using Blackboard, review your course syllabus. You may access Blackboard via the Northern Virginia website: www.odu.edu/nvc by selecting STUDENTS, then IMPORTANT LINKS, and BLACKBOARD.

ODU ID Cards

ALL registered Old Dominion University students must have a student ID card. ID Pictures are taken at the Center. Please see Student Services to get your picture taken and ID request processed. We will continue to process ID cards until April 27th, 2009.

Textbooks/Course Paks/Syllabi

Textbooks and/or Course Paks are available for purchase through **efollet.com**, a mail-order company affiliated with the Follet Higher Education Group. Orders may be placed online at www.odudlbooks.com. Click on FIND YOUR TEXTBOOKS. Choose SELECT YOUR TERM and SELECT "TELETECHNET." Choose your course and course reference number using the appropriate menu boxes. In the event that **efollet.com** does not carry your textbook/course materials, the ODU main campus bookstore can be reached at 757-683-0048.

Syllabi: To obtain a copy of your course syllabus, *please check your Blackboard account first*. Many ODU professors post their syllabi on Blackboard. If a syllabus is not posted prior to your first class meeting, please contact the instructor via email to obtain this document.

University Testing Requirements

ALL degree-seeking undergraduate students, including transfer students (with or without credit for freshman composition) **MUST** pass the **Writing Sample Placement Test (WSPT)** during their **FIRST** semester of admission. Transfer students who do not pass the WSPT will not be permitted to register for a second semester unless a plan for successful completion is developed with the Writing Center on main campus. A passing score on the WSPT is a prerequisite to register for the Exit Exam of Writing Proficiency. Students should see Student Services to register for the test.

ALL undergraduate students, including those seeking a second baccalaureate degree, **MUST** pass the University's **Exit Examination of Writing Proficiency (EEWP)** prior to the date of graduation. Students should take the exam as soon as they have accumulated 58 hours of credit and have passed the Writing Sample Placement Test. Students should see Student Services to register for the test.
